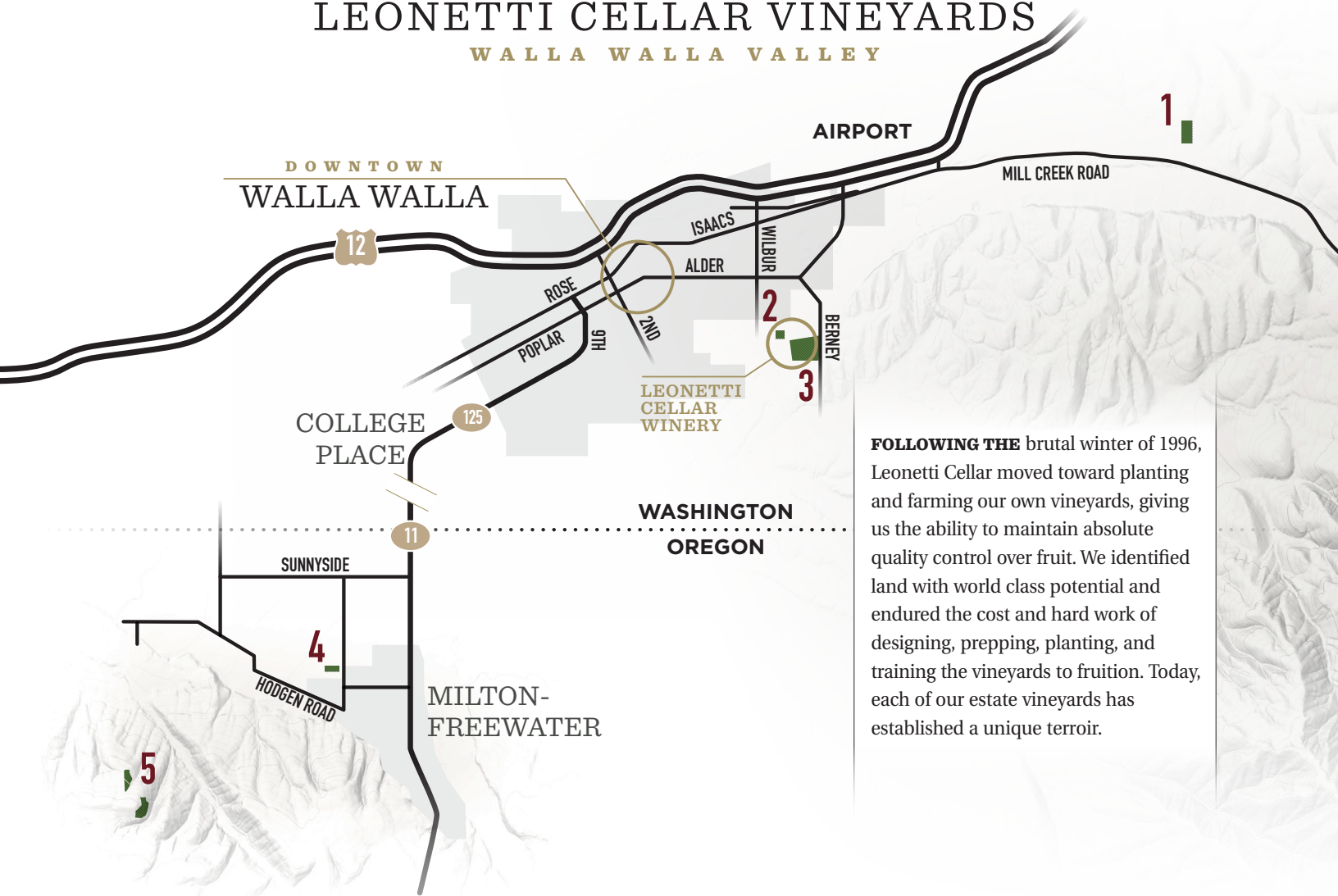


LEONETTI CELLAR VINEYARDS

WALLA WALLA VALLEY



FOLLOWING THE brutal winter of 1996, Leonetti Cellar moved toward planting and farming our own vineyards, giving us the ability to maintain absolute quality control over fruit. We identified land with world class potential and endured the cost and hard work of designing, prepping, planting, and training the vineyards to fruition. Today, each of our estate vineyards has established a unique terroir.

MILL CREEK UPLAND

On a perfectly crowned hillside in the foothills of the Blue Mountains lies our Mill Creek Upland Vineyard. The first in what is now becoming a destination for Bordeaux varietal vineyards, it is noted for huge temperature swings from day to night, which breeds power, density, and firm acidity in the wines.

LEONETTI OLD BLOCK

The oldest vineyard in the Walla Walla Valley, this tidy block next to the winery makes some of the most unique Merlot we work with. The aromas are always uniquely of crushed fresh flowers and petrol and the beautifully delicate texture reflects that of the unique Onyx silt loam on which it grows. We're proud to own this heritage block!

LOESS

Since Leonetti's founding in 1977, Gary had coveted the hillside to the East of the winery, and in 1999 we were finally able to acquire the land and plant it a few years later. Ever since it has become a true backbone for all of our Bordeaux varietal wines, producing wines with stunning aromatics and perfect balance.

HOLY ROLLER

Our first venture into The Rocks District of Milton-Freewater. The fruit from this impossibly cobbled vineyard produces wines of polished texture, minerality, salinity, and plush fruit that are always approachable even in their youth.

ASPECT Gently Westerly Slope
VARIETALS Cabernet Sauvignon, Sangiovese
SOIL Freewater Very Cobbly Loam

SERRA PEDACE

Named after my great grandparents, Frank and Rose Leonetti's hometown in Calabria, Italy. The terraces carved into the side of this incredibly steep East-facing slope — on never before farmed, shallow and rocky soils — are a unique site in the Valley. This windy hillside produces wines of extraordinary density and power.

ELEVATION 1,200-1,430 feet
ASPECT South, East, North
VARIETALS Cabernet Sauvignon, Aglianico
SOIL Walla Walla Silt Loam – Licksillet Very Stony Loam – Anderly Silt Loam
